Kindergarten Enrolments 2019

Parents and carers are able to call in to office reception to pick up an enrolment application form. You may fill in the form on the spot or you can take it away then bring it back later. Applications are due on Friday, July 20. That's the first Friday of Term 3. All enrolments received by the due date are put through the same assessment. Application received after July 20 are at the bottom of the list.

Enrolment Application – Assessment Process

The same system is used by all public schools. Applications are placed in to one of four categories.

Priority 1: Students within our local catchment area with siblings already at Upper Swan.

Priority 2: Students within our local catchment area with no siblings at Upper Swan.

Priority 3: Students outside our local catchment area with siblings already at Upper Swan.

Priority 4: Students outside our local catchment area with no siblings at Upper Swan.



Students with equal priority are then ranked according to their distance from the school "as the crow flies".

If recent years are anything to go by, all priority 1 and priority 2 students will be accepted. It is most likely, but not guaranteed, that most priority 3 students may get a place. The number of priority 4 students to receive an offer depends on how many places are left.

Application / Assessment Result

By late August families are informed of the outcome of their application.

Aveley North 2019: Are Your Children Moving?

Next year Aveley North opens for all year levels: Kindy to Year 6. Students at Upper Swan who are now in Aveley North's zone have the option of staying at Upper Swan or moving across to the new school. It is important for both schools to know how many students will be moving to Aveley North. Please let me know as soon as possible if your children are moving.

A map of Aveley North's local intake area is attached. Some of the main roads in their area are Millhouse, Aveley, Chateau, Ellen Brook, Hermitage, Verdelho, Burgundy, Vines, Shiraz, Holdsworth, Cashman, Thredbo, Bellazario, Wistful, Torres and Duvall.

Pre Primary Enrolments 2019

The same timeline and process is used to assess Pre Primary enrolment applications. Only students in Priority 1 and 2 categories are 100% guaranteed of a place in Pre Primary. Those in Priority 3 and 4 categories are highly likely to get an offer, but no guarantee can be given.

Mrs Lee (Mondays / Tuesdays) will soon have enrolment applications for all families to collect from your child's classroom.

Office Hours 8:15 to 3:45

This will give them time to set up their schedule at the beginning of the day and to complete any last minute business before they go home. NAPLAN - Year 3 and Year 5

We aim to have all NAPLAN online assessments completed between May 15 and May 18.

It is important that "NAPLAN days" are treated as any other school day. Make sure your children have a good night's sleep, a healthy breakfast and arrive at school between 8:30 and 8:40. These are the things I expect you would do every day.

As much as possible, it is important for parents to manage any anxiety their children may have. While we want all students to give a good account of themselves, the way a person's life is going to turn out is not determined by a Year 3 or Year 5 NAPLAN test. NAPLAN does not measure the importance of your child to their family, their friends, their class and our school. It does not measure their personal qualities or their attitude to life and learning. Albert Einstein is credited with saying something like: "Not everything that can be measured is important and not everything that is important can be measured."


