The children practised turn-taking, cooperation, coordination, and problem-solving while staying cool and having a blast. Water play continues to be an amazing sensory, social, and physical learning experience!

Sensory Trays - Exploring, Discovering & Learning

Our sensory trays have been hugely popular this week, offering calming, imaginative, hands-on fun. The children explored a water sensory tub, a loose-parts construction tray, and the favourite of the week—iceberg animal rescue! The children worked together to "free" the animals frozen in ice blocks while learning about endangered polar species, climate change, melting patterns, and cause-and-effect. Sensory play helps children build fine-motor skills, language, creativity, and scientific thinking while having loads of fun.

Arts & Craft – Slimy, Scented & Colourful Creations

Arts and Crafts were wonderfully messy and incredibly fun this week! Describing the children made slime in many colours, experimenting with texture, stretchiness, and sensory feel. They also made beautifully scented playdough, choosing fragrances like lavender, vanilla, and lemon We finished with a large collaborative group painting, where the children shared ideas, mixed colours, and worked together to create one big masterpiece.
